



CDTRP ROLES and RESPONSIBILITIES
May 30, 2019

There are three roles for academic participants in the CDTRP:

- CDTRP Investigator
- CDTRP Associate Member
- CDTRP Collaborator

CDTRP INVESTIGATORS (includes Theme Leads and Co-Leads):

- have made themselves aware of and will adhere to the obligations and regulations set out in the CDTRP Coalition Agreement (including but not limited to stipulations regarding publications, intellectual property, confidentiality, conflict resolution, governance, and evaluation) that has been signed by their institution on their behalf
 - (download a summary of the Coalition Agreement at: <https://goo.gl/v5Boml>)
 - (download the CDTRP Publication Policy at: <https://goo.gl/D25djQ>)
- will contribute where possible to the research goals of the CDTRP by producing, accessing, presenting and/or publishing CDTRP data according to the CDTRP Publication Guidelines and Coalition Agreement
- are eligible to receive research funding from the CDTRP (if receiving funding, must sign an annual Research Agreement)
- will participate in generation and submission of reports upon request regarding CDTRP activities and in particular the annual progress report for research programs in which they are identified as a participant
- are encouraged to list the CDTRP as an author affiliation in their publications
- are required to acknowledge the CDTRP on all publications and presentations that derive from CDTRP activities or collaborations
- are expected to attend monthly Theme/Platform teleconferences
- are expected to attend the CDTRP Annual Scientific meeting, and regional CDTRP meetings, whenever possible (and can receive support to attend)
- will participate in CDTRP activities, when possible, including:
 - CDTRP committees (Evaluations Committee, New Initiatives Committee, Patient Engagement Initiative, etc.)
 - CDTRP peer-review processes (grants/awards, manuscripts)
 - training program (webinars, curriculum development, etc.)
 - other CDTRP activities when requested (Café Scientifique, spokesperson, media, etc.)



BENEFITS offered to CDTRP Investigators

- eligible to apply to CDTRP grant competitions as a Principal Applicant
- receive regular CDTRP updates and communications via email and Sosido (and is considered a Sosido 'Member')
- have access to the CDTRP internal website and Dropbox to view and share data/presentations/manuscripts
- can receive support from the CDTRP Research Services Platform, the CDTRP Data Innovations Platform, the CDTRP Education and Career Development Platform, CDTRP Patient Researcher Partnership Platform, and the CDTRP Central Management Team
- can receive support from the CDTRP for external grant applications (i.e. letters of support and collaboration)
- have access to training opportunities

CDTRP ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

- have made themselves aware of and will adhere to the obligations and regulations set out in the CDTRP Coalition Agreement (including but not limited to stipulations regarding publications, intellectual property, confidentiality, conflict resolution, governance, and evaluation) that has been signed by their institution on their behalf (download a summary of the Coalition Agreement at: <https://goo.gl/v5Boml>) (download the CDTRP Publication Policy at: <https://goo.gl/D25djQ>)
- do not directly produce, access, present and/or publish CDTRP data (but can be a co-author)
- can apply to CDTRP grant competitions with a current CDTRP Investigator listed as a co-applicant (and if successful, would become a CDTRP Investigator)
- are invited to attend relevant monthly Theme/Platform teleconferences to be kept informed and contribute to the discussions
- can attend the CDTRP Annual Scientific meeting (but are not obliged to attend and no support is extended)
- can receive regular CDTRP communication and updates if desired (classified as a Sosido 'Follower')
- do not have access to the CDTRP internal website or Dropbox
- can apply to be a CDTRP Investigator by completing and submitting a CDTRP Application form (available to download at: www.CDTRP.ca/joining)
- can receive support from the CDTRP for external grant applications (i.e. letters of support and collaboration)

CDTRP COLLABORATORS

- at arm's length from the Theme/Platform (do not attend regular calls or meetings)
- do not directly produce, access, present and/or publish CDTRP data (but can be a co-author if involved in the study)
- can apply to CDTRP grant competitions with a current CDTRP Investigator listed as a co-applicant (if successful, would become a CDTRP Investigator)
- can receive general CDTRP updates if desired (Sosido 'Follower')
- do not have access to the CDTRP internal website or Dropbox
- can apply to be a CDTRP Investigator, by completing and submitting a CDTRP Application form (available to download at: www.CDTRP.ca/joining)
- can receive support from the CDTRP for external grant applications (i.e. letters of support and collaboration)
